"Leadership in Business – Process or Person?"

Dr Allister McQuoid, *Energia*

Allister is MD of Energia, the Viridian Group's all-Ireland energy supply business. He has held senior management positions with Pilkington, GEC Marconi and Shorts and worked extensively overseas until returning to NI in 1997. Allister has an MBA from the Sloan Business School at Massachusetts Institute of Technology and has received a Doctorate in Astrophysics from Queen's University.

Sir Ronnie Flanagan, *HM Inspector of Constabulary*

Sir Ronnie joined the Royal Ulster Constabulary in 1970 and became Chief Constable in 1996. He retired from the PSNI in 2002 and is now Her Majesty's Inspector of Constabulary for London and the East Region. Sir Ronnie was awarded the OBE in 1996, received a Knighthood in 1998 and was awarded a Knight Grand Cross of the Order of the British Empire in 2002.

Mark is Chairman of the MLN (formerly the Management Council), He is also on the council of the IoD and the Chamber of Commerce. Mark is currently CEO of Airtricity NI, and a Non-Executive Director of several companies. He is now Vice Chair of CBI having been Chair in 2000 & 2001.

Dr Aideen McGinley, *Dept of Culture, Arts & Leisure*

Aideen is Permanent Secretary of DCAL and was formerly Chief Executive of Fermanagh District Council. Dr Patrick Haren, *Viridian Group PLC*
